


ALTERNATIVE SCHOOL DRESS CODE

A Uniform Dress Code has been put in place at the Alternative School to eliminate confusion, build pride, and help students focus on their education.



1. Solid tan pants or skirts.
2. Shirts with a buttoned collar, turtle necks, polo shirts in solid white only.
3. Hoods, writing, pictures and T-shirts are not acceptable.
4. Pants and skirts must be worn with a black or brown belt and at waist/hip level. Oversized belt buckles are not allowed.
5. Skirts are to be knee length or longer (must touch the middle of knee cap when standing).
6. Shirts are to be tucked in. No skin showing between shirt and pants and underclothing may not be visible at any time.
7. No shorts or tank tops.
8. Hats, bandanas, and/or head coverings of any type may not be worn inside the building or on school grounds.
9. Jackets must be placed on the hooks provided in the hallways before entering the classroom. Solid white sweaters or sweatshirts without hoods may be worn to class.
10. Hair styles or colors deemed by the Coordinator to be distracting or disruptive will not be permitted.
11. Body piercing and jewelry are not allowed in school or at school sponsored activities. (except watches and earrings)
12. Tattoos must be covered at all times. Students will be required to wear long sleeves shirts to cover any exposed tattoos.

Important Note: Any student in violation of any of the Alternative School Dress Code rules will have their parents called and/or be sent home until the situation is corrected. This will be considered an unexcused absence. A student that has been sent home for Dress Code violations will be issued a Discipline Referral. The coordinator will determine whether something is appropriate or not.
